

### Leadership Blair County Youth kicks-off year with orientation

Leadership Blair County Youth (LBCY) began another exciting year with an orientation that brought together twenty-four high school sophomores, many meeting for the first time.

Launched twenty-three years ago, the program, sponsored by Berry Solutions Group, was created based on the



highly successful Leadership Blair County Adult program. The youth class consists of students representing six public schools and Bishop Guilfoyle Academy.

"The Leadership Blair County Youth program brings 10th grade students together from area schools to help them grow as leaders through hands-on experiences, community engagement, public speaking and personal development. It's exciting to see their energy and potential as we kicked off this year's journey together," said Tami Chadick, LBCY facilitator.

Throughout the nine-month long program students will learn a full range of leadership skills that will enable them to become active members in their communities. The curriculum is carefully designed to address issues that many young people face. The key points of instruction come from the guidance of an advisory group that strategically develops topics and activities. Everything from social pressures, leadership skills, public speaking, local history, and community service are covered. There is no cost for students to participate. All the funding to run the program comes from grants, fundraisers and the business community.

"With the help of feedback from the prior year students, the Advisory Group meets monthly during the school year and reviews the upcoming sessions to ensure they include current topics that are both informative and interactive for the students, while remaining focused on servant leadership."" said Gary Drenning, chair of the LBCY Advisory Group.


